Chef Reese's culinary journey began 22 years ago when he attended culinary school in Portland, Oregon. Following his education, he ventured to Maui, Hawaii, where he honed his skills in Pacific Island cuisine at the renowned Mamma's Fish House.

Eventually, Reese returned to his hometown of Lake Tahoe, Nevada, where he quickly made a mark as a Sous Chef at the esteemed Edgewood Golf Course, achieving this milestone at the young age of 23. His passion for culinary excellence led him to open two successful restaurants in Santa Cruz, California. Seeking new experiences, Reese then embarked on a culinary adventure in Seattle, Washington, managing a bistro known for its affiliation with Beecher Cheese.

More recently, Reese held the position of Chef at the Farmhouse Restaurant in Belmont. California. captivating diners with his innovative creations. Last season, he served as the Executive Chef at the Alaska Sportsman Lodge in Bristol Bay, further expanding his culinary repertoire through diverse travel experiences. Throughout extensive journey, Chef Reese has developed a profound appreciation for fresh ingredients and a mastery of world techniques, which continue to fuel his drive in creating unique and upscale dishes.

Lauren Harrington, hailing from Northern Arizona and Sonoma County, brings her unique background to Lost. Originally from Maryland, she made her way to Phoenix in 2003, eventually settling in Flagstaff where her love for the mountains of Arizona blossomed. In 2013, she ventured to wine country in Sonoma County, joining Jackson Family Wines and specializing in wine tours and pairings.

Reuniting with Chef Reese in 2002, the duo embarked on an adventurous journey together. Now, they find themselves humbled and grateful to be part of the vibrant community in Greer and the stunning White Mountains. Their shared passion for the area's beauty and their dedication to their craft make them an wonderful addition to Lost and Greer.



GREER SPOTLIGHT THE LAZY TROUT

Summer is here, and with it comes the rain, high water, and good fishing.



The Lazy Trout: A Greer Classic

Bait and tackle shop meet convenience store, The Lazy Trout has been a staple of life in Greer for decades. In October 2020, the shop was purchased by Joel and Ashley Price, who hope to maintain its legacy. Married for almost 23 years, the Price's both attended U of A and have lived the valley for much of their life. But Joel's first encounter with Greer was as a Boy Scout troop leader, and Ashley began visiting a few years back when they started their family.

The decision to buy The Lazy Trout came about during the pandemic, when Joel and Ashley were spending more and more time in Pinetop. They were relishing in the slower pace of life here, and they quickly realized this was where they wanted to raise their family. Taking over the store felt like the right next step, and Ted and Nancy, the Lazy Trout's previous owners, felt like the couple was the perfect fit. But the White Mountains aren't always the easiest place to live; Joel tells us the business brings a new challenge every month–freezing pipes, freezing temperatures, and winter floods aren't easy to handle, but the pair is learning fast.



Joel and Ashley's initial goal was to maintain the store's original charm and make the locals proud. Now, they also aim to expand by taking the store online, offering merchandise that connects people back to Greer. Building relationships with locals and relishing in the freedom to fish has helped the couple deeply embrace the community up here, and they told us that living in the mountains has truly changed their perspective, allowing for more spontaneity in their lives and a more authentic connection to the natural world.



GET YOUR FISHING ON FISHING REPORTS



SURROUNDING AREA

Big Lake - GOOD

Big Lake has been asleep and very cold. The late winter has kept the bite off. I've only heard of a few fish being caught. That stated, Big Lake could turn on any time. Those of you in the know, know that right when it starts, fishing can be excellent. Still rating it as "Good" - especially on a calm day. Worth a look!

A1 Lake - GOOD

No official report, but the lake is clear and people are fishing here. I believe it has been stocked at least once this season. Water is high...all the way back into the timber. Reservation permit required.

Hawley Lake - GOOD

Only two reports so far. Both stated that stocked fish are being caught. Fishing should pick up as the weather warms. Reservation permit required.

Reservation Lake - GOOD

Smaller, stocked fish are being caught at Reservation. Many larger fish are being spotted cruising the shallows. Reservation permit required.

GREER LAKES

Bunch Reservoir - VERY GOOD

Bunch has been stocked 3 times as of this writing. Fishing for stocked rainbow trout is very good. Power Bait fished off the bottom, worms suspended from bobbers, and various flies and lures are all working.

Tunnel Reservoir - VERY GOOD

Tunnel has been stocked 3 times as of this writing. Fishing for stocked rainbow trout is very good. Power Bait fished off the bottom, worms suspended from bobbers, and various flies and lures are all working.

Tunnel Reservoir - GOOD

River has been stocked twice as of this writing. Not many reports coming from River as anglers are concentrating more on Bunch and Tunnel. Fishing should pick up as the weather warms.

LITTLE COLORADO RIVER

West Fork - FAIR

Only heard a few reports from the LCR in Greer. According to the schedule, it has been stocked twice as of this writing. Due to the continuing run-off, the river is still running rather high, but a few fish have been caught.

East Fork - NO REPORT

There are trout in this section of the LCR. However, due to the heavy snow pack and the continuing run-off, fishing could be rough and muddy.

- Made up of three reservoirs: Bunch, Tunnel, and River.
- Elevation 8,200ft
- Open year round
- No live bait fishing
- Maybe single motor boat ONLY
- Rainbow trout & brown trout
- Located in Greer

RESERVATION LAKE

- Elevation 9.000ft
- Open April to November ONLY
- Shoreline fishing
- Single motor boat only, boat rentals available
- Rainbow trout, brook trout, brown trout
- Convenience store available
- 1 hour and 40 minutes from Greer 39.6 miles

HAWLFYLAKE

- Elevation 8,200ft
- Open year round
- Camping permitted, shoreline fishing
- No boat restrictions, boat rentals available at convenience store
- Daily fish permit required
- Rainbow trout, cutthroat trout, brown trout, brook trout
- 1 hour from Greer 29.4 miles

The Casitas provide modern amenities without sacrificing access to the outdoors. In fact, steps outside the front door lay the meadows, ponds, and Little Colorado River. The main room provides a mini fridge, microwave, coffee maker, as well as lounge furniture and a television. You probably won't even need the TV, as you'll be in the center of some of the best views in Greer.





CABIN SPOTLIGHT: Greer Cozy Cottage

Radiating charm, Greer Cozy Cabin is 550 square ft with two beds and one bath. The cabin also offers a sleeper sofa and in-unit laundry! Karen Barton bought the cabin in 2020 after falling in love with Greer; it has become a respite from the scorching Phoenix heat and a place to relish in the winter snowfall. Karen tells us she'll never forget how she woke up on Thanksgiving morning in 2020 to a flurry of early snowfall.
